YOUTH CHARITY HORSE SHOW

Illinois State Fairgrounds Springfield, Illinois

T he Youth Charity Horse Show is not a member of USEF nor AQHA. YCHS uses the above mentioned organizations rulebooks as guidelines for this show. Youth and Open will be identified as follows: All classes are for exhibitors 18 years of age and under unless otherwise specified. For horse show purposes the age of an individual on January 1st shall be maintained through the entire show. Persons born on January 1st shall assume the greater age. Proof of age may be requested by the Show Secretary, and any falsification of age will result in automatic disqualification with no refund.

- Every entry shall constitute an agreement that the person making it is subject to the rules and regulations of the Youth-Charity Horse Show.
- The Youth Charity Horse Show and its Board of Directors will not be responsible for any damages to person, animal or property at the show or on the Fairgrounds, nor shall they be liable for any accidents or injuries sustained by persons or animals on the show grounds at any time. Neither will they be responsible for any vehicle or any equipment which is lost, stolen or damaged.
- The Horse Show Committee reserves the right to decline any entry and to prohibit any persons from attending or showing a horse, or rider from the show without being liable for compensation or refund.
- 4. Regular entries must be postmarked by September 1, 2022.
- Post entries will be accepted from September 2, 2022 throughout the horse show. Post entry fees will be \$17 per class.
- Exhibitors cancelling their entries after September 1, 2022, without a veterinarian certificate shall forfeit their entry fees. There will be no refund of stall rent. Out of state horses must have a 30 day Health Certificate with a permit number.
- No entry will be judged unless payment has been made prior to the horse entering the ring, or an open check is on file in the Horse Show Office.
- Copy of current negative Coggins must be made available upon request. Random inspections are made in the barn areas.
- Horse stalls and tack stalls with doors will be provided at a charge of \$70.00. Every entry must have a stall. All stall fees must accompany the entry blank.

- Requests for "group stalling" must be made prior to September 1, 2022.
 Although no guarantees, YCHS will make every effort to accommodate your request. Requests for "group stalling" received after September 1, 2022 may not be honored.
- Tack stalls shared by exhibitors must be paid to the Horse Show by one exhibitor.
- 12. There will be an Office Charge of \$12.00 per exhibitor.
- A \$1.00 fee is required on each show number issued. This fee will not be refunded when exhibitor checks out.
- No open checks will be accepted with entries prior to the start of the show.
- Classes: Classes using this symbol indicate "Fun Classes". In some classes, there are restrictions. Please be sure to read the class description for reference.
- All Exhibitors: Please refer to Class Descriptions in all divisions you are entering before completing your entry form. Entries not completed in full, signed and accompanied with payment will not be processed.
- 17. If any entry is being shown by more than one exhibitor, separate entry form must be submitted. Only one exhibitor per entry form.
- All exhibitors showing in 4-H Classes must present current 4-H identification to the Horse Show Office.
- 19. Registration papers must be provided for all breed specific classes.
- No stallions will be allowed in the Youth Charity Horse Show. Don't even ask!
- No dogs allowed in Coliseum. We remind dog owners that they are responsible for their animals and must be on a leash.
- Signing of the entry form declares that each horse and exhibitor are eligible as entered. Parent/Legal Guardian must sign at bottom of entry form.
- Trainers/Instructors/Legal Guardians: If you are bringing exhibitors to YCHS, please get a signed waiver from exhibitor's parent/legal guardian indicating that you are responsible for exhibitor in the event of an accident.
- A trophy and eight (8) ribbons will be presented in each class unless otherwise specified.
- The Horse Show Committee reserves the right to cancel, combine, divide or run concurrently any class or classes should such be in the best interest of the show. Exhibitors will be notified accordingly.
- Management reserves the right to change or alter Officials lists without notice prior to or during the show.
- 27. NO RIDING IN THE AISLES.
- Trail Classes will be shown starting at 8 a.m. on Saturday, October 8, in <u>SECOND RING</u>. Trail exhibitors must stay in line after check-in, if exhibitor has to leave, when exhibitors checks-in again, exhibitor must go in new order.
- Dressage will be shown on Sunday, October 9, starting at 8 a.m. (SECOND RING) in a short arena.
- All classes will be shown in the order listed unless the Horse Show Committee deems it necessary to rearrange classes in the best interest of the show.
- During each horse show session, at the discretion of the Show Committee, an appropriate warm up time will be provided for specific classes.
 For example: Pleasure Driving, etc.
- 32. Whips no longer than 6' including the snapper or lash.
- 33. No lunging will be allowed during each horse show session.

- 34. Food for exhibitors may be purchased on the Fairgrounds.
- Feed and Bedding for horses may be purchased on the Fairgrounds. Phone: 217-899-6001.
- 36. Camping fee at Illinois State Fairground to be announced.
- 37. ALL DECISIONS OF THE JUDGES ARE FINAL.
- Pony measurements will be done on Friday, Oct. 7, 2022. Place and time to be announced. Permanent height cards accepted including YCHS card.
- 39. Point System derived on a show number/per exhibitor basis. Points will be as follows: 1st—8 points, 2nd—7 points, 3rd—6 points, 4th—5 points, 5th—4 points, 6th—3 points, 7th—2 points, 8th—1 point. For classes with less then 8 exhibitors points will be awarded for the number of exhibitors in the class.
- Scratches or Additions must be completed 3 classes prior to the class you are scratching or adding.
- 41. Classes that need to be split will be done so by the Show Secretary. The splits will be posted at least 2 classes prior to that class. Exhibitors must show in the split in which they are posted. Class splits will be run as a complete class, to be judged and placed as a class. If the order needs to be changed, gate personnel must be notified. Failure to do so will result in elimination.
- 42. IF YOU SWITCH A STALL WITHOUT PERMISSION FROM THE HORSE SHOW OFFICE, IT IS AN AUTOMATIC DISQUALIFICATION FROM PARTICIPATION IN THE HORSE SHOW.
- 43. You must check in at the gate for each class and each class split or it will be assumed you have scratched from the class. No communication will result in elimination. A one minute gate rule will be enforced. After the final call for a class has been given, the gate will be closed in one minute, and no late participants will be accepted. Barn calls are made as a courtesy. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to be aware of the progression of the show and be ready for their class when it enters the arena. No refunds for missed classes.
- 44. If there is a hold on the gate for whatever reason (i.e. tack change, mount change, etc.) there will be a hold of three minutes. Barn Announcer/Paddock Master must be notified for each gate hold. In the event that any exhibitor is entered in two classes in separate areanas that have a potential to be showing at the same time, the Paddock Master of each arena must be notified by filing a class conflict notification with each. The Paddock Master will make an attempt to accommodate conflicts. Please keep the Paddock Master of each arena advised if your situation changes.
- 45. Any rider falling off of a horse in either flat or jumping classes will be automatically excused. A loose horse in halter or showmanship will be an automatic disqualification. Any horse or pony beyond the exhibitors control may be disqualified or excused from the arena.
- Helmets are encouraged. No penalization for helmets in any class including western.
- 47. HIGH POINT ALL AROUND. THIS AWARD IS BASED ON ONE HORSE/RIDER (NO SUBSTITUTIONS) ACCUMULATING THE MOST POINTS IN ALL POINTED CLASSES. MUST HAVE POINTS IN AT LEAST 2 DIVISIONS AND AT LEAST ONE TRAIL CLASS.
- Any exhibitor using an electronic device in the show arena will be immediately disqualified. (Exception: Reasonable Accommodation certificate has been issued and declared in the show office.)

- 49 In-Hand and Saddleseat classes exhibitor numbers should be worn on the exhibitor's back, below the shoulders. Stock Seat classes one number must be on EACH side of the saddle blanket. Hunt Seat classes one number must be on each side of the saddle blanket OR on the riders back easily visible to judge and show management. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to verify, prior to entry into the ring, the correctness of their number. The number goes with the horse.
- 50. Disqualification: Abuse—any horse that shows evidence of fresh blood in the mouth, nose, chin, shoulder, barrel, flank or hip area will be considered to be abused and may be excused from the arena. Sportsmanship—any exhibitor that has made or caused to be made any false statement in regard to any animal or article exhibited, or if any exhibitor shall attempt to interfere with the judges in the performance of their duties, he or she shall be excluded from exhibiting. General—In all individual work classes, simple majority opinion of the judges shall prevail. Lameness—A horse will be excused from the arena if a simple majority of judges disqualify the entry due to lameness.

SADDLESEAT DIVISION

- A. Rider will be judged on seat, hands and ability to control and show horse. Performance of horse is not more important than the methods used by the rider.
- Saddleseat riders must adhere to use of correct diagonals at the trot.
- C. Academy attire and equipment are allowed within the saddleseat division. Acceptable rider attire is jods, long sleeve shirt, tie, vest. Helmet recommended. Horse equipment is snaffle with martingale or full bridle but may not have show shoe package.
- **#6 Saddleseat Halter [S]** To be shown in correct saddleseat attire with saddleseat tack according to breed. Excessive use of whips to be penalized.
- **#7 Saddleseat Showmanship [S]** Class is solely judged on contestant's ability to fit and show pony/horse in hand. Conformation of animal is not to count.
- **#15 Pleasure Driving [S]** To be shown at a flat walk, trot and extended trot both ways of the ring and hitched to an appropriate two wheel. Headers will be permitted. They may stand inside the ring during the class, but will not be allowed to interfere with the performance of the horse. This is merely a safety measure. Class may be split to accommodate horses and ponies.
- **#19 Saddleseat Country Pleasure [S]** To be shown at walk and favorite gait both ways of the ring.
- #24 American Saddlebred/Morgan Saddleseat Pleasure [S] To be shown at a flat walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. Must stand quietly and back readily.
- **#30 Mature Saddleseat Pleasure Horse [S]** English horse to be 15 years of age or older. To be shown at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring.
- **#56 Walk-Trot Trail:** 10 & Under (Second Ring) [S,W,H,G] Trail horses required to work over and through obstacles. Rider will have 3 attempts at obstacle before being asked to move on to the next obstacle. Rider not eligible for walk-trot-canter classes.
- **#58 English Trail 11-13 Yrs. (Second Ring) [S,H]**Trail horses required to work over and through obstacles.
 Rider will have 3 attempts at obstacle before being asked to move on to the next obstacle.
- #60 English Trail 14-18 Yrs. (Second Ring) [S,H]
 Trail horses required to work over and through obstacles.
 Rider will have 3 attempts at obstacle before being asked to move on to the next obstacle.
- #65 Walk-Trot Saddleseat Pleasure: 12 & Under [S] To be shown at a walk and a trot both ways of the ring. Rider not eligible for walk-trot-canter classes.

- **#83 Saddleseat Equitation: 14-18 Yrs. [S]** To be shown at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring.
- **#85** 4-H, FFA, Pony Club Saddleseat Pleasure [S] Exhibitor to be current member of a recognized 4-H Club, FFA, or Pony Club. Horse to be shown at a flat walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring.
- #88 Show Hack [S] To be shown at a walk, trot, canter, and hand gallop, collected, extended and normal gaits, to stand quietly and back readily. No more than 12 horses to hand gallop at one time. To be judged on manners, performance, quality and conformation. Shadbelly or Hunter attire required.
- **#90 Saddleseat Pleasure 13 & Under [S]** To be shown at a flat walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring.
- **#96** Bareback Pleasure Saddleseat & Huntseat [S, H] Open to any breed ridden bareback at the walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. Judged as a performance class with proper Saddleseat and Huntseat attire required.
- #107 Saddleseat Ideal Horse [S] Ideal class is a performance class. The class displays the balance required of a pleasure horse which also exhibits good conformation. To be judged on confirmation after the under saddle work. Two grooms per horse are permitted in the arena. Wheel barrows, carts or any type of mechanical apparatus are prohibited in the ring. To be shown at 3 gaits both ways of the ring, required to back, extended gait may be required. Time limit for grooming/stripping is 2 minutes.
- #117 Saddleseat & Huntseat Pairs On The Flat [S, H] Open to any breed. Optional equipment. To be shown at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. To be judged as a matched pair, but this is not paramount. Emphasis on matched stride of horses and matched attire of riders, and the ability of the riders to have horses move at the same rate and exactly together. Entry fee on each horse. This is a performance class; proper attire only. Horse or rider may not enter class #118 or 119.
- **#120 Saddleseat Equitation: 13 Yrs & Under [S]** To be shown at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring.
- #122 Saddleseat Pleasure: 14-18 Yrs. [S] To be shown at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring.
- **#124 Arabian Saddleseat Pleasure [S]** to be shown at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. Light contact must be maintained with all gaits.
- #126 Morgan/Arabian/Half Arabian/National Show Horse/ American Saddlebred Western Pleasure [S] To be shown at a flat walk, jog-trot and lope both ways of the ring with light rein but still maintaining contact with the horse's mouth.

SADDLESEAT DIVISION

- A. Rider will be judged on seat, hands and ability to control and show horse. Performance of horse is not more important than the methods used by the rider.
- Saddleseat riders must adhere to use of correct diagonals at the trot.
- C. Academy attire and equipment are allowed within the saddleseat division. Acceptable rider attire is jods, long sleeve shirt, tie, vest. Helmet recommended. Horse equipment is snaffle with martingale or full bridle but may not have show shoe package.
- **#6 Saddleseat Halter [S]** To be shown in correct saddleseat attire with saddleseat tack according to breed. Excessive use of whips to be penalized.
- **#7 Saddleseat Showmanship [S]** Class is solely judged on contestant's ability to fit and show pony/horse in hand. Conformation of animal is not to count.

- **#30 Mature Saddleseat Pleasure Horse [S]** English horse to be 15 years of age or older. To be shown at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring.
- **#56 Walk-Trot Trail:** 10 & Under (Second Ring) [S,W,H,G] Trail horses required to work over and through obstacles. Rider will have 3 attempts at obstacle before being asked to move on to the next obstacle. Rider not eligible for walk-trot-canter classes.
- **#58 English Trail 11-13 Yrs. (Second Ring) [S,H]**Trail horses required to work over and through obstacles.
 Rider will have 3 attempts at obstacle before being asked to move on to the next obstacle.
- #60 English Trail 14-18 Yrs. (Second Ring) [S,H]
 Trail horses required to work over and through obstacles.
 Rider will have 3 attempts at obstacle before being asked to move on to the next obstacle.
- #65 Walk-Trot Saddleseat Pleasure: 12 & Under [S] To be shown at a walk and a trot both ways of the ring. Rider not eligible for walk-trot-canter classes.

- **#83 Saddleseat Equitation: 14-18 Yrs. [S]** To be shown at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring.

 For example: Pleasure Driving, etc.
- 32. Whips no longer than 6' including the snapper or lash.
- 33. No lunging will be allowed during each horse show session.

- 34. Food for exhibitors may be purchased on the Fairgrounds.
- Feed and Bedding for horses may be purchased on the Fairgrounds. Phone: 217-899-6001.
- 36. Camping fee at Illinois State Fairground to be announced.
- 37. ALL DECISIONS OF THE JUDGES ARE FINAL.
- Pony measurements will be done on Friday, Oct. 7, 2022. Place and time to be announced. Permanent height cards accepted including YCHS card.
- 39. Point System derived on a show number/per exhibitor basis. Points will be as follows: 1st—8 points, 2nd—7 points, 3rd—6 points, 4th—5 points, 5th—4 points, 6th—3 points, 7th—2 points, 8th—1 point. For classes with less then 8 exhibitors points will be awarded for the number of exhibitors in the class.
- Scratches or Additions must be completed 3 classes prior to the class you are scratching or adding.
- 41. Classes that need to be split will be done so by the Show Secretary. The splits will be posted at least 2 classes prior to that class. Exhibitors must show in the split in which they are posted. Class splits will be run as a complete class, to be judged and placed as a class. If the order needs to be changed, gate personnel must be notified. Failure to do so will result in elimination.
- 42. IF YOU SWITCH A STALL WITHOUT PERMISSION FROM THE HORSE SHOW OFFICE, IT IS AN AUTOMATIC DISQUALIFICATION FROM PARTICIPATION IN THE HORSE SHOW.
- 43. You must check in at the gate for each class and each class split or it will be assumed you have scratched from the class. No communication will result in elimination. A one minute gate rule will be enforced. After the final call for a class has been given, the gate will be closed in one minute, and no late participants will be accepted. Barn calls are made as a courtesy. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to be aware of the progression of the show and be ready for their class when it enters the arena. No refunds for missed classes.
- 44. If there is a hold on the gate for whatever reason (i.e. tack change, mount change, etc.) there will be a hold of three minutes. Barn Announcer/Paddock Master must be notified for each gate hold. In the event that any exhibitor is entered in two classes in separate areanas that have a potential to be showing at the same time, the Paddock Master of each arena must be notified by filing a class conflict notification with each. The Paddock Master will make an attempt to accommodate conflicts. Please keep the Paddock Master of each arena advised if your situation changes.
- 45. Any rider falling off of a horse in either flat or jumping classes will be automatically excused. A loose horse in halter or showmanship will be an automatic disqualification. Any horse or pony beyond the exhibitors control may be disqualified or excused from the arena.
- Helmets are encouraged. No penalization for helmets in any class including western.
- 47. HIGH POINT ALL AROUND. THIS AWARD IS BASED ON ONE HORSE/RIDER (NO SUBSTITUTIONS) ACCUMULATING THE MOST POINTS IN ALL POINTED CLASSES. MUST HAVE POINTS IN AT LEAST 2 DIVISIONS AND AT LEAST ONE TRAIL CLASS.
- Any exhibitor using an electronic device in the show arena will be immediately disqualified. (Exception: Reasonable Accommodation certificate has been issued and declared in the show office.)

- 49 In-Hand and Saddleseat classes exhibitor numbers should be worn on the exhibitor's back, below the shoulders. Stock Seat classes one number must be on EACH side of the saddle blanket. Hunt Seat classes one number must be on each side of the saddle blanket OR on the riders back easily visible to judge and show management. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to verify, prior to entry into the ring, the correctness of their number. The number goes with the horse.
- 50. Disqualification: Abuse—any horse that shows evidence of fresh blood in the mouth, nose, chin, shoulder, barrel, flank or hip area will be considered to be abused and may be excused from the arena. Sportsmanship—any exhibitor that has made or caused to be made any false statement in regard to any animal or article exhibited, or if any exhibitor shall attempt to interfere with the judges in the performance of their duties, he or she shall be excluded from exhibiting. General—In all individual work classes, simple majority opinion of the judges shall prevail. Lameness—A horse will be excused from the arena if a simple majority of judges disqualify the entry due to lameness.

YOUTH CHARITY HORSE SHOW

Illinois State Fairgrounds Springfield, Illinois

T he Youth Charity Horse Show is not a member of USEF nor AQHA. YCHS uses the above mentioned organizations rulebooks as guidelines for this show. Youth and Open will be identified as follows: All classes are for exhibitors 18 years of age and under unless otherwise specified. For horse show purposes the age of an individual on January 1st shall be maintained through the entire show. Persons born on January 1st shall assume the greater age. Proof of age may be requested by the Show Secretary, and any falsification of age will result in automatic disqualification with no refund.

- Every entry shall constitute an agreement that the person making it is subject to the rules and regulations of the Youth-Charity Horse Show.
- The Youth Charity Horse Show and its Board of Directors will not be responsible for any damages to person, animal or property at the show or on the Fairgrounds, nor shall they be liable for any accidents or injuries sustained by persons or animals on the show grounds at any time. Neither will they be responsible for any vehicle or any equipment which is lost, stolen or damaged.
- The Horse Show Committee reserves the right to decline any entry and to prohibit any persons from attending or showing a horse, or rider from the show without being liable for compensation or refund.
- 4. Regular entries must be postmarked by September 1, 2022.
- Post entries will be accepted from September 2, 2022 throughout the horse show. Post entry fees will be \$17 per class.
- Exhibitors cancelling their entries after September 1, 2022, without a veterinarian certificate shall forfeit their entry fees. There will be no refund of stall rent. Out of state horses must have a 30 day Health Certificate with a permit number.
- No entry will be judged unless payment has been made prior to the horse entering the ring, or an open check is on file in the Horse Show Office.
- Copy of current negative Coggins must be made available upon request. Random inspections are made in the barn areas.
- Horse stalls and tack stalls with doors will be provided at a charge of \$70.00. Every entry must have a stall. All stall fees must accompany the entry blank.

HUNTER DIVISION

- A. USEF approved (USPC: ASTM-SEI approved) hard hat with safety harness is required of ALL RIDERS while mounted for all Hunter Classes. Elastic chin straps ARE NOT ALLOWED.
- B. Please note the NEW JUMPING CLASS DEFINITIONS, which are specific to "horse/rider combinations" and not restricted by age or experience.
- C. If a whistle is blown during your Warm Up Over Fence or Hunter Over Fence Classes, you must exit the ring. You will not be permitted to remount if a fall has occurred.
- **#8 Conformation Hunter: 14-18 Yrs. [H]** To be shown in proper hunter attire with Hunter type bridle and bit. No whips allowed.
- **#9 Showmanship Hunter: 14-18 Yrs. [H]** Class solely judged on contestant's ability to fit and show pony/horse in hand. Conformation of animal is not to count.
- **#10 Conformation Hunter: 13 Yrs & Under [H]** To be shown in proper Hunter attire with Hunter type bridle and bit. No whips allowed.
- **#11 Showmanship Hunter: 11-13 Yrs. [H]** Class solely judged on contestant's ability to fit and show pony/horse in hand. Conformation of animal is not to count.
- **#12 Showmanship Hunter: 10 Yrs. & Under [H]** Class solely judged on contestant's ability to fit and show pony/horse in hand. Conformation of animal is not to count.
- **#27 Hunter Country Pleasure 14-18 Yrs. [H]** To be shown at walk and favorite gait both ways of the ring.
- #28 Hunter Country Pleasure 13 & Under [H] To be shown at walk and favorite gait both ways of the ring.
- #29 Mature Hunter Horse/Pony on the Flat [H] Hunter horse must be 15 years of age or older. To be shown at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring.
- #31 Huntseat Equitation on the Flat Walk-Trot: 10 Yrs. & Under [H] To be shown at a walk and trot both ways of the ring. Not to jump. Rider not eligible for walk-trot-canter classes.
- **#32** Huntseat Equitation on the Flat: 10 Yrs. & Under [H] To be shown at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. Not to jump.
- #33 Huntseat Equitation on the Flat: 11-13 Yrs. [H] To be shown at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. Not to jump.
- **#34** Huntseat Equitation on the Flat: 14-18 Yrs. [H] To be shown at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. Not to jump.

- #35 Hunter Hack: 13 Yrs & Under [H] Horses will be asked to jump two jumps at 2', hand gallop, then halt. Horses may be asked to back up as well. Horses will then be shown on the flat at a walk, trot, and canter both ways of the ring. Class will be judged on an even hunting pace, manners, way of going and hunting style.
- #36 Hunter Hack: 14-18 Yrs. [H] Horses will be asked to jump two jumps at 2', hand gallop, then halt. Horses may be asked to back up as well. Horses will then be shown on the flat at a walk, trot, and canter both ways of the ring. Class will be judged on an even hunting pace, manners, way of going and hunting style.
- #37 Cross Rails Warm Up Over Fences 18" [©] This class will not be judged. Your entry fee entitles you to 1 warm up round or 1.5 minutes in the ring. Only horses entered in the Cross Rail division may enter this warm up class.
- #38 Cross Rails Over Fences 18" [H] Horse to be judged on manners, way of going, pace and suitability of horse to rider. Course will consist of one change of direction. The same horse/rider combination may not enter any other jumping division.
- **#39 Cross Rails Equitation Over Fences 18" [H]** Same as above. Equitation of the rider to be judged.
- #40 Advanced Warm Up Over Fences: 2'9" [◎] This class will not be judged. Your entry fee entitles you to 1 warm up round or 1.5 minutes in the ring. Only horses entered in the Advanced division or Jumper class may enter this warm up class.
- **#41 Advanced Hunter Over Fences: 2'9"-3' [H]** Horses to be judged on manners, way of going, pace, and suitability of horse to rider. The same horse/rider combination may not enter any other jumping division.
- #42 Advanced Hunter Equitation Over Fences; 2'9"-3' [H] Same as above. Equitation of the rider to be judged.
- #43 Advanced Handy Hunter Over Fences: 2'9"-3' [H] Horses to be judged on manners, way of going pace and suitability of horse to rider. Handiness of the horse and rider, i.e. stops, sharp turns and backing up may be required. The same horse/rider combination may not enter any other jumping division.
- **#44 Intro Jumper Over Fences: [H]:** Refer to USEF Table II: Section 2B 2'6"
- #45 Beginner Warm Up Over Fences 2'3"-2'6" [②] This class will not be judged. Your entry fee entitles you to 1 warm up round or 1.5 minutes in the ring. Only horses entered in the Beginner over fence classes may enter this warm up class.
- #46 Beginner Hunter Over Fences: 2'3"-2'6" [H] Horses to be judged on manners, way of going, pace, and suitability of horse to rider. The same horse/rider combination may not enter any other jumping division.

- #74 Child/Parent Wak-Trot Western [@] Child will ride the first way of the ring and the parent will ride the same horse that the child rode in the reverse way of the ring. Horse to be shown at a walk, and jog. Must be legal parent/guardian. Must show proof of legal guardianship.
- #75 Child/Parent Saddleseat: [③] Child will ride the first way of the ring and the parent will ride the same horse that the child rode in the reverse way of the ring. Horse to be shown at a walk, trot and canter. Must be legal parent/guardian. Must show proof of legal guardianship.
- #76 Child/Parent Walk-Trot Saddleseat: [③] Child will ride the first way of the ring and the parent will ride the same horse that the child rode in the reverse way of the ring. Horse to be shown at a walk, and trot. Must be legal parent/guardian. Must show proof of legal guardianship.
- #77 Egg & Spoon: Walk-Trot-Canter [@] Rider to negotiate both ways of the ring at a walk, trot and canter while carrying an egg in a spoon. Dropping of egg eliminates rider.
- #81 Musical Chairs [③] Done in pairs. Two riders, one horse, one entry fee on that horse only. Entry fee is to be paid by one exhibitor only and that exhibitor number is to be worn in the arena. One exhibitor stands in the middle of the ring while partner rides around circle to music. When the music stops, the pair switches places. At least one exhibitor to be in control of the horse at all times. Last exhibitor to mount is eliminated.

 Both exhibitors need to sign individual entries.
- #93 Ride A "Five" Buck [◎] To ride bareback with a \$5.00 bill placed between the horse and rider's left knee. (Exhibitor to furnish \$5.00 bill) Horse to walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. Artificial aids strictly prohibited: i.e. no grip spray, suede knee pads, chaps, etc. Winner takes all \$\$\$.
- #101 Dressage: 10 Yrs. & Under, English or Western, Intro A, Walk & Trot 2019 (Second Ring) [D] Copies of the test will be available through the show office. The test will be ridden in a small (20x40 meter) arena. A horse may be ridden by more than one rider. Readers will be allowed. Riders will not be eligible for walk-trot-canter classes.
- #102 Dressage: 10 Yrs. & Under, English or Western, Intro B, Walk & Trot 2019 (Second Ring) [D] Same as above.
- #103 Dressage: Training Level Test 1, 13 & Under [D] Same as above except Walk-Trot-Canter as required.
- #104 Dressage: Training Level Test 1, 14-18 [D] Same as above.

- #105 Dressage: Training Level Test 2, 13 & Under [D] Same as above.
- #106 Dressage: Training Level Test 2, 14-18 [D] Same as above.
- #108 Lead Line Western: 2-6 Yrs. [3] The rider may be asked by the Judge to perform basic skills at the walk, while on the lead. Rider is only eligible for lead line classes and stick horse. Minimum age of leader is 16. Lead Line is one exhibitor.
- #109 Lead Line Saddleseat & Huntseat: 2-6 Yrs. [@] Same as above. Minimum age of leader is 16. Lead Line is one exhibitor.
- #110 Lead Line Walk-Trot Open: 4-8 Yrs. [③] Show at a walk and trot or jog. To be judged on position and control of horse. Rider is only eligible for lead line classes and stick horse. Minimum age of leader is 16. Lead Line is one exhibitor.
- #111 Egg & Spoon: Walk-Trot Only: 10 Yrs. & Under [③] Rider to negotiate both ways of the ring at a walk, and trot while carrying an egg in a spoon. Dropping of egg eliminates rider. Riders will not be eligible for walk-trot-canter classes.
- #112 Stick Horse: 2-6 Yrs. [②] Exhibitor must provide his/ her own stick horse. Judge may ask for a variety of gaits. Unruly stick horses will be excused.
- #125 Group Costume [@] Consisting of one or more horses and two or more exhibitors. Judged on originality and creativity. No throwing or tossing of candy or items into audience. If mounted rider must have bridle on horse. Adults can participate for safety only, NOT as part of the costume. No other animals in costume class. Limited to one costume class. Entry fee is per horse not per exhibitor.
- #127 Lead Line Costume 2-8 Yrs. [③] Judged on originality and creativity. Minimum age of leader is 16. Leader dressing up is optional. No other animals in costume class. Rider is only eligible for lead line classes and stick horse. Limited to one costume class.
- #128 Individual Costume [@] Consisting of one horse and one exhibitor. Judged on originality and creativity. No throwing or tossing of candy or items into audience. If mounted rider must have bridle on horse. Adults can participate for safety only, NOT as part of the costume. No other animals in costume class. Limited to one costume class.

HUNTER DIVISION

- A. USEF approved (USPC: ASTM-SEI approved) hard hat with safety harness is required of ALL RIDERS while mounted for all Hunter Classes. Elastic chin straps ARE NOT ALLOWED.
- B. Please note the NEW JUMPING CLASS DEFINITIONS, which are specific to "horse/rider combinations" and not restricted by age or experience.
- C. If a whistle is blown during your Warm Up Over Fence or Hunter Over Fence Classes, you must exit the ring. You will not be permitted to remount if a fall has occurred.
- **#8 Conformation Hunter: 14-18 Yrs. [H]** To be shown in proper hunter attire with Hunter type bridle and bit. No whips allowed.
- **#9 Showmanship Hunter: 14-18 Yrs. [H]** Class solely judged on contestant's ability to fit and show pony/horse in hand. Conformation of animal is not to count.
- **#10 Conformation Hunter: 13 Yrs & Under [H]** To be shown in proper Hunter attire with Hunter type bridle and bit. No whips allowed.
- **#11 Showmanship Hunter: 11-13 Yrs. [H]** Class solely judged on contestant's ability to fit and show pony/horse in hand. Conformation of animal is not to count.
- **#12 Showmanship Hunter: 10 Yrs. & Under [H]** Class solely judged on contestant's ability to fit and show pony/horse in hand. Conformation of animal is not to count.
- **#27 Hunter Country Pleasure 14-18 Yrs. [H]** To be shown at walk and favorite gait both ways of the ring.
- #28 Hunter Country Pleasure 13 & Under [H] To be shown at walk and favorite gait both ways of the ring.
- #29 Mature Hunter Horse/Pony on the Flat [H] Hunter horse must be 15 years of age or older. To be shown at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring.
- #31 Huntseat Equitation on the Flat Walk-Trot: 10 Yrs. & Under [H] To be shown at a walk and trot both ways of the ring. Not to jump. Rider not eligible for walk-trot-canter classes.
- **#32** Huntseat Equitation on the Flat: 10 Yrs. & Under [H] To be shown at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. Not to jump.
- #33 Huntseat Equitation on the Flat: 11-13 Yrs. [H] To be shown at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. Not to jump.
- **#34** Huntseat Equitation on the Flat: 14-18 Yrs. [H] To be shown at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. Not to jump.

- #35 Hunter Hack: 13 Yrs & Under [H] Horses will be asked to jump two jumps at 2', hand gallop, then halt. Horses may be asked to back up as well. Horses will then be shown on the flat at a walk, trot, and canter both ways of the ring. Class will be judged on an even hunting pace, manners, way of going and hunting style.
- #36 Hunter Hack: 14-18 Yrs. [H] Horses will be asked to jump two jumps at 2', hand gallop, then halt. Horses may be asked to back up as well. Horses will then be shown on the flat at a walk, trot, and canter both ways of the ring. Class will be judged on an even hunting pace, manners, way of going and hunting style.
- #37 Cross Rails Warm Up Over Fences 18" [©] This class will not be judged. Your entry fee entitles you to 1 warm up round or 1.5 minutes in the ring. Only horses entered in the Cross Rail division may enter this warm up class.
- #38 Cross Rails Over Fences 18" [H] Horse to be judged on manners, way of going, pace and suitability of horse to rider. Course will consist of one change of direction. The same horse/rider combination may not enter any other jumping division.
- **#39 Cross Rails Equitation Over Fences 18" [H]** Same as above. Equitation of the rider to be judged.
- #40 Advanced Warm Up Over Fences: 2'9" [◎] This class will not be judged. Your entry fee entitles you to 1 warm up round or 1.5 minutes in the ring. Only horses entered in the Advanced division or Jumper class may enter this warm up class.
- **#41 Advanced Hunter Over Fences: 2'9"-3' [H]** Horses to be judged on manners, way of going, pace, and suitability of horse to rider. The same horse/rider combination may not enter any other jumping division.
- #42 Advanced Hunter Equitation Over Fences; 2'9"-3' [H] Same as above. Equitation of the rider to be judged.
- #43 Advanced Handy Hunter Over Fences: 2'9"-3' [H] Horses to be judged on manners, way of going pace and suitability of horse to rider. Handiness of the horse and rider, i.e. stops, sharp turns and backing up may be required. The same horse/rider combination may not enter any other jumping division.
- **#44 Intro Jumper Over Fences: [H]:** Refer to USEF Table II: Section 2B 2'6"
- #45 Beginner Warm Up Over Fences 2'3"-2'6" [②] This class will not be judged. Your entry fee entitles you to 1 warm up round or 1.5 minutes in the ring. Only horses entered in the Beginner over fence classes may enter this warm up class.
- #46 Beginner Hunter Over Fences: 2'3"-2'6" [H] Horses to be judged on manners, way of going, pace, and suitability of horse to rider. The same horse/rider combination may not enter any other jumping division.

- #47 Beginner Hunter Equitation Over Fences: 2'3"-2'6" [H] Same as above. Equitation of rider to be judged.
- #48 Beginner Handy Hunter Over Fences: 2'3"-2'6" [H] Horses to be judged on manners, way of going pace and suitability of horse to rider. Handiness of the horse and rider, i.e. stops, sharp turns and backing up may be required. The same horse/rider combination may not enter any other jumping division.
- #49 Warm Up Over Fences 2' [②] This class will not be judged. Your entry fee entitles you to 1 warm up round or 1.5 minutes in the ring. Only horses entered in the Pony, Short Stirrup, and Pairs division may enter this warm up class.
- **#50 Pony Hunter Over Fences: 2' [H]** For ponies 14.2 hands and under. Entries must show a permanent pony measurement card or be measured by show staff for entry into this class.
- **#51 Short Stirrup Hunter Over Fences: 2'** [H] Horses to be judged on manners, way of going, pace, and suitability of horse to rider. The same horse/rider combination may not enter any other jumping division.
- **#52 Short Stirrup Equitation Over Fences: 2' [H]** Same as above. Equitation of the rider to be judged.
- #53 Short Stirrup Handy Hunter Over Fences: 2' [H] Handiness of the horse and rider to be judged. Stops, tight turns, and backing up may be required.
- #54 Pairs Over Fences: 2' [H] Horses to enter ring together. First horse to start over course with the second horse following at a safe distance. At the point indicated on the course diagram, second horse to take the lead with the first horse following at a safe distance. Last fence to be jumped as a pair (together). Last fence will be widened. Entry fee on each horse. The same "horse/rider" combination is not allowed to enter pairs over fences more than once. Proper hunter attire and tack required. THIS IS NOT A FUN CLASS.
- #56 Walk-Trot Trail: 10 & Under (Second Ring) [S,W,H,G] Trail horses required to work over and through obstacles. Rider will have 3 attempts at obstacle before being asked to move on to the next obstacle. Rider not eligible for walk-trot-canter classes.

- **#58 English Trail 11-13 Yrs. (Second Ring) [S,H]**Trail horses required to work over and through obstacles.
 Rider will have 3 attempts at obstacle before being asked to move on to the next obstacle.

- **#64 Walk-Trot Hunter On The Flat: 10 Yrs. & Under [H]** To be shown at a walk and a trot both ways of the ring. Rider not eligible for walk-trot-canter classes.
- #96 Bareback Pleasure Saddleseat & Huntseat [S, H]
 Open to any breed ridden bareback at the walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. Judged as a performance class with proper Saddleseat and Huntseat attire required.
- **#98 Hunter On The Flat: 10 Yrs. & Under [H]** To be shown at a walk, trot, and canter both ways of the ring.
- #99 Hunter On The Flat: 11-13 Yrs. [H] Same as above.
- #100 Hunter On The Flat: 14-18 Yrs. [H] Same as above.
- #113 Hunter Pony On The Flat: 14.2 Hands & Under [H]
 To be shown at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring.
- #114 4-H, FFA, Pony Club Hunter On The Flat: 13 Yrs. & Under [H] To be shown at a walk, trot, and canter both ways of the ring. Exhibitors to be current and active member of a recognized 4-H Club, FFA, or Pony Club.
- #115 4-H, FFA, Pony Club Hunter On The Flat: 14-18 Yrs. [H] Same as above.
- #116 Hunt Seat Ideal Horse [H] Ideal class is a performance class. The class displays the balance required of a pleasure horse which also exhibits good conformation. To be judged on confirmation after the under saddle work. Two grooms per horse are permitted in the arena. Wheel barrows, carts or any type of mechanical apparatus are prohibited in the ring. To be shown at 3 gaits both ways of the ring, required to back, extended gait may be required. Time limit for grooming/stripping is 2 minutes.
- #117 Saddleseat & Huntseat Pairs On The Flat [S, H]
 Open to any breed. Optional equipment. To be shown at a
 walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. To be judged as a
 matched pair, but this is not paramount. Emphasis on
 matched stride of horses and matched attire of riders, and the
 ability of the riders to have horses move at the same rate and
 exactly together. Entry fee on each horse. This is a performance class; proper attire only. Horse or rider may not enter
 class #118 or 119.

- **#20 Western Horsemanship: 14-18 Yrs. [W]** To be shown at a walk, jog-trot and lope. Western equipment and attire required. Individual pattern will be required.
- #21 Western Horsemanship: 11-13 Yrs. [W] Same as above.
- #22 Western Horsemanship: 10 Yrs. & Under [W] Same as above.
- #23 Western Horsemanship Walk-Trot: 10 Yrs. & Under [W] To be shown at a walk, and jog-trot. Western equipment and attire required. Individual pattern will be required. Rider not eligible for walk-trot-canter classes.
- #25 Ranch Pleasure: 13 & Under [W] The horse should have a natural ranch horse appearance from head to tail in each maneuver. To be shown on the rail at a walk, trot, and lope. Extended gaits will be required.
- #26 Ranch Pleasure: 14-18 Yrs. [W] Same as above.
- **#56 Walk-Trot Trail: 10 & Under (Second Ring) [S,W,H,G]**Trail horses required to work over and through obstacles.
 Rider will have 3 attempts at obstacle before being asked to

- **#59 Western Trail 11-13 Yrs.** (Second Ring) [W] Trail horses required to work over and through obstacles. Rider will have 3 attempts at obstacle before being asked to move on to the next obstacle.
- #61 Western Trail 14-18 Yrs. (Second Ring) [W]
 Trail horses required to work over and through obstacles.
 Rider will have 3 attempts at obstacle before being asked to move on to the next obstacle.
- **#71 Quarter Horse Western Pleasure: 14-18 Yrs. [W]**Horse to be shown at walk, jog-trot, and lope both ways of the ring.
- **#72 Walk-Trot Western Pleasure: 10 Yrs. & Under [W]**Horse to be shown at a walk and jog-trot both ways of the ring. Rider not eligible for walk-trot-canter classes.
- **#78 Western Pleasure: 11-13 Yrs. [W]** Horse to be shown at walk, jog-trot, and lope both ways of the ring.
- #79 4-H, FFA, Pony Club Western Pleasure: 13 Yrs. & Under [W] Same as above but exhibitor must be current and active member of a recognized 4-H Club, FFA, or Pony Club.
- #80 4-H, FFA, Pony Club Western Pleasure: 14-18 Yrs. [W] Same as above.
- #82 Quarter Horse Western Pleasure: 13 Yrs. & Under [W] Horse to be shown at a walk, jog-trot and lope both ways of the ring.
- #86 Paint Western Pleasure: 13 Yrs. & Under [W] Same as above.
- #87 Paint Western Pleasure: 14-18 Yrs. [W] Same as above.
- #89 Appaloosa/POA Western Pleasure [W] Same as above.
- #91 Western Pleasure: 14-18 Yrs. [W] Same as above.
- #92 Western Ideal Horse [W] Ideal class is a performance class. The class displays the balance required of a pleasure horse which also exhibits good conformation. To be judged on confirmation after the under saddle work. Two grooms per horse are permitted in the arena. Wheel barrows, carts or any type of mechanical apparatus are prohibited in the ring. Gaited Division

#13 Gaited Model Horse [G] Similar to an English Halter class. Enter at a fast walk, line up and present horses according to breed standards.

#14 Gaited Showmanship [G] Class is solely judged on contestant's ability to fit and show pony/horse in hand. Conformation not to count.

#56 Walk-Trot Trail: 10 & Under (<u>Second Ring</u>) [S,W,H,G] Trail horses required to work over and through obstacles. Rider will have 3 attempts at obstacle before being asked to move on to the next obstacle. Rider not eligible for walk-trot-canter classes.

#57 Trail: Gaited Horses (Second Ring) [G]
Trail horses required to work over and through obstacles.
Rider will have 3 attempts at obstacle before being asked to move on to the next obstacle.

#68 Gaited Horse Western Pleasure [G] Horse to be shown at a trail walk, flat walk, gaited trot according to breed standards, and lope. Will be required to back. Shown in western tack and attire.

#84 Gaited Ideal Horse [G] Ideal class is a performance class. The class displays the balance required of a pleasure horse which also exhibits good conformation. To be judged on confirmation after the under saddle work. Two grooms per horse are permitted in the arena. Wheel barrows, carts or any type of mechanical apparatus are prohibited in the ring. To be shown at 3 gaits both ways of the ring, required to back, extended gait may be required. Time limit for grooming/stripping is 2 minutes.

#95 Bareback Gaited [G] To be shown same as Gaited Performance. Cannot enter any other bareback class.

#97 Gaited Performance [G] To be shown at the flat walk and gaited trot according to breed standards. No lope or back required. Shown in tack and attire required by breed standards.

#119 Gaited Pairs [G] To be shown at a flatwalk, gaited trot and canter both ways of the ring. To be judged as a matched pair, but this is not paramount. Emphasis on matched stride of horses and matched attire of riders, and the ability of the riders to have horses move at the same rate and exactly together. Entry fee on each horse. This is a performance class, proper attire only. Horse or rider may not enter class #117 or 118.

MISCELLANEOUS DIVISION

A. Classes in this division do not count for High Point.

#55 Lead Line Trail 2-8 Yrs. (Second Ring) [W]
Trail horses required to work over and through obstacles. Rider will have 3 attempts at obstacle before being asked to move on to the next obstacle. Rider is only eligible for lead line classes and stick horse. Minimum age of leader is 16. Lead Line is one exhibitor.

#62 Riders With Disabilities Trail To Show At 10:00 [◎] (Second Ring) Trail horses required to work over and through obstacles. Maximum of 1 horse leader and 2 side walkers allowed.

#63 UPHA Exceptional Challenge Cup 12 Yrs. & Up [☺] Open to all riders 12 Yrs. of age and older, with a mental or physical handicap; riding a mare or gelding of any breed. Open to walk and trot riders only. To be shown at the walk and trot both directions of the ring with an individual workout of a 4 loop serpentine and return to the line up at a trot. The riders are not allowed headers or side walkers. Coaches are allowed in the ring at the gate during the class as a safety measure. Showing in this class qualifies the rider for the UPHA Exceptional Challenge Cup Finals in November at the American Royal. Rider may never have been judged in a class at a recognized or non-recognized show that required a canter.

#66 Child/Parent Huntseat: [②] Child will ride the first way of the ring and the parent will ride the same horse that the child rode in the reverse way of the ring. Horse to be shown at a walk, trot and canter. Must be legal parent/guardian. Must show proof of legal guardianship.

#67 Child/Parent Walk-Trot Huntseat: [③] Child will ride the first way of the ring and the parent will ride the same horse that the child rode in the reverse way of the ring. Horse to be shown at a walk and trot. Must be legal parent/guardian. Must show proof of legal guardianship.

#69 Child/Parent Walk-Trot Gaited:[@] Child will ride the first way of the ring and the parent will ride the same horse that the child rode in the reverse way of the ring. Horse to be shown at a walk and gaited trot. Must be legal parent/guardian. Must show proof of legal guardianship.

#70 Child/Parent Gaited:[③] Child will ride the first way of the ring and the parent will ride the same horse that the child rode in the reverse way of the ring. Horse to be shown at a walk, gaited trot, and canter. Must be legal parent/guardian. Must show proof of legal guardianship.

#73 Child/Parent Western [@] Child will ride the first way of

- #74 Child/Parent Wak-Trot Western [@] Child will ride the first way of the ring and the parent will ride the same horse that the child rode in the reverse way of the ring. Horse to be shown at a walk, and jog. Must be legal parent/guardian. Must show proof of legal guardianship.
- #75 Child/Parent Saddleseat: [③] Child will ride the first way of the ring and the parent will ride the same horse that the child rode in the reverse way of the ring. Horse to be shown at a walk, trot and canter. Must be legal parent/guardian. Must show proof of legal guardianship.
- #76 Child/Parent Walk-Trot Saddleseat: [③] Child will ride the first way of the ring and the parent will ride the same horse that the child rode in the reverse way of the ring. Horse to be shown at a walk, and trot. Must be legal parent/guardian. Must show proof of legal guardianship.
- #77 Egg & Spoon: Walk-Trot-Canter [@] Rider to negotiate both ways of the ring at a walk, trot and canter while carrying an egg in a spoon. Dropping of egg eliminates rider.
- #81 Musical Chairs [③] Done in pairs. Two riders, one horse, one entry fee on that horse only. Entry fee is to be paid by one exhibitor only and that exhibitor number is to be worn in the arena. One exhibitor stands in the middle of the ring while partner rides around circle to music. When the music stops, the pair switches places. At least one exhibitor to be in control of the horse at all times. Last exhibitor to mount is eliminated.

 Both exhibitors need to sign individual entries.
- #93 Ride A "Five" Buck [◎] To ride bareback with a \$5.00 bill placed between the horse and rider's left knee. (Exhibitor to furnish \$5.00 bill) Horse to walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. Artificial aids strictly prohibited: i.e. no grip spray, suede knee pads, chaps, etc. Winner takes all \$\$\$.
- #101 Dressage: 10 Yrs. & Under, English or Western, Intro A, Walk & Trot 2019 (Second Ring) [D] Copies of the test will be available through the show office. The test will be ridden in a small (20x40 meter) arena. A horse may be ridden by more than one rider. Readers will be allowed. Riders will not be eligible for walk-trot-canter classes.
- #102 Dressage: 10 Yrs. & Under, English or Western, Intro B, Walk & Trot 2019 (Second Ring) [D] Same as above.
- #103 Dressage: Training Level Test 1, 13 & Under [D] Same as above except Walk-Trot-Canter as required.
- #104 Dressage: Training Level Test 1, 14-18 [D] Same as above.

- #105 Dressage: Training Level Test 2, 13 & Under [D] Same as above.
- #106 Dressage: Training Level Test 2, 14-18 [D] Same as above.
- #108 Lead Line Western: 2-6 Yrs. [3] The rider may be asked by the Judge to perform basic skills at the walk, while on the lead. Rider is only eligible for lead line classes and stick horse. Minimum age of leader is 16. Lead Line is one exhibitor.
- #109 Lead Line Saddleseat & Huntseat: 2-6 Yrs. [@] Same as above. Minimum age of leader is 16. Lead Line is one exhibitor.
- #110 Lead Line Walk-Trot Open: 4-8 Yrs. [③] Show at a walk and trot or jog. To be judged on position and control of horse. Rider is only eligible for lead line classes and stick horse. Minimum age of leader is 16. Lead Line is one exhibitor.
- #111 Egg & Spoon: Walk-Trot Only: 10 Yrs. & Under [③] Rider to negotiate both ways of the ring at a walk, and trot while carrying an egg in a spoon. Dropping of egg eliminates rider. Riders will not be eligible for walk-trot-canter classes.
- #112 Stick Horse: 2-6 Yrs. [②] Exhibitor must provide his/ her own stick horse. Judge may ask for a variety of gaits. Unruly stick horses will be excused.
- #125 Group Costume [@] Consisting of one or more horses and two or more exhibitors. Judged on originality and creativity. No throwing or tossing of candy or items into audience. If mounted rider must have bridle on horse. Adults can participate for safety only, NOT as part of the costume. No other animals in costume class. Limited to one costume class. Entry fee is per horse not per exhibitor.
- #127 Lead Line Costume 2-8 Yrs. [③] Judged on originality and creativity. Minimum age of leader is 16. Leader dressing up is optional. No other animals in costume class. Rider is only eligible for lead line classes and stick horse. Limited to one costume class.
- #128 Individual Costume [@] Consisting of one horse and one exhibitor. Judged on originality and creativity. No throwing or tossing of candy or items into audience. If mounted rider must have bridle on horse. Adults can participate for safety only, NOT as part of the costume. No other animals in costume class. Limited to one costume class.
